# **Peanut Allergy Alert!**



Dear Students, Parents, Kookums and Mooshums,

I just want to remind everyone that we have not one but two students who are allergic to peanuts. **Therefore, no food made with peanuts will be allowed in the school**. If you send snacks with your children, make sure it has the peanut free logo on it. If it does not, I ask that you teach your child not to share their snack just in case it may contain peanuts.

**The peanut restriction only applies to peanuts**. Other nuts like almonds, walnuts and cashews are safe as longs as it was not mixed with peanuts.

And thank you to the parents who informed us of the allergies. Without that info, it makes it harder to keep the students safe. If your child has an allergy or a medical condition, please let me or the teachers know as soon as possible.

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# Conklin Community Reward System:



- 1. Every student who gets perfect attendance gets \$20 credit at school store.
- 2. Every student who gets 95% attendance gets \$10 credit at school store.
- 3. Every student who gets 90% attendance gets \$5 credit at school store.
- 4. Every student who gets a High Five Award gets \$25 credit at school store.
- 5. Every student earns \$0.50 per day that they attend.
- 6. Principal will maintain a credit ledger in the office.
- 7. Students may redeem their credits at school store once a month.
- 8. Students may save their credits to purchase a bigger item in another month. Teachers will encourage this through math lessons.
- 9. If an item is not on our store, a student may order through the principal.
- 10. Items in the store will be sold at face value (dollar for dollar).
